

Looking Forward

- We will work to reduce the use of single-use plastics in a campaign called "Choose-to-Reuse."
- We will work to reduce the use of gas blowers and mowers in our communities.
- We will work to reduce the number of cars inappropriately idling around our schools and public places.

Our Four Program Areas

Water

We work to prevent pollution in our watershed, promote water conservation inside and outside the home, and divert storm water to rain gardens and bioswales in order to catch water where it falls.



Waste

We educate residents and organizations on the value of reducing consumption, and offer on-the-ground assistance on how to effectively recycle and compost waste.

Watts

We promote the move from fossil fuels to clean electricity by encouraging the use of electric cars, electric kitchens, and electric garden equipment in addition to encouraging the installation of photovoltaic and heat-pump systems and more.

WoW

We encourage people to get out of their cars and on their bikes or on their feet by hosting bike tours, promoting Safe Routes to Schools, hosting bike valets at major events, and more.

A Sampling of our Accomplishments



After viewing the powerful documentary "Straws: A Documentary for a Sea of Change" in January, a group of highly motivated volunteers partnered with GreenTown to begin a campaign to encourage local restaurants to first offer **straws only on request**, then switch to **paper straws**, and when appropriate encourage residents to use **reusable straws**.



To address the number one source of pollution in San Francisco Bay, storm water runoff, we advocated for more **green infrastructure and permeable materials** to be included in the proposed City of Los Altos Shoulder Paving Policy.



We hosted **seven community forums**, to help fulfill our mission to educate and inspire our community, with topics ranging from the invisible housing crisis, traffic issues, parks and open space and fuel switching. Our most popular event of the year was a screening of the documentary "Straws" which inspired a community led campaign to reduce the use of straws in town.



Anti-Idling Campaign GreenTown initiated an educational campaign to reduce toxic air pollutants and greenhouse gases by reducing discretionary vehicle idling. In conjunction with the Los Altos Environmental Commission we surveyed and published results of discretionary vehicle idling at major parking lots, streets and five schools. The City of Los Altos has directed staff to refrain from idling City vehicles and has installed anti-idling signs in parking lots of City facilities.



With the generous support of our donors and a grant from the Los Altos Community Foundation, we hired three collegebound **interns** from Los Altos High School to support our programs and gain job skills.



GreenTown once again hosted the annual **ReCycle Bike Drive** where we rehabilitated used bikes for people in need. to ensure people, especially students, can ride their bikes safely, we work with the Safe Routes to Schools program, and hosted community forums about traffic issues in both north and south Los Altos.
