

## **Program Highlights**

#### Clean Air

- Introduced the Induction Cooktop Loaner Program
- Advocated for building electrification
- Supported the development of Los Altos' Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP)
- Worked with regional Realtor associations and legislative bodies to understand the benefits of building electrification
- Co-sponsored the Code Red for Humanity webinar series profiling the urgent need for climate action
- Continued efforts with Los Altos Code Enforcement to measure call/citation ratios and strengthened awareness and effectiveness of gas leaf blower ordinances

#### Conservation

- Hosted 75 people on an Edible Trees walking tour
- Planted 93 more trees for a total of 311 as part of the ongoing 500 Trees Campaign
- Incorporated drought-tolerant planters in an Arts Los Altos exhibit on Third Street
- Revitalized the Woodland Library drought-tolerant demonstration garden
- Educated the public on watershed pollution sources using the EnviroScape interactive display
- Adopted the Los Altos section of the Permanente Diversion Channel and participated in National River cleanup day to reduce waste flow to The Bay including reusing 86 tennis balls by giving them to an assisted living facility for residents with walkers

#### **Eating Green**

- Created the Eating Green Food Club to support local restaurants who feature vegan options and create a community of people interested in plant-based foods
- Joined with Acterra for its Plantiful New Year Challenge

#### **Transportation**

- Parked 233 bikes at the Art and Wine Festival and Fine Art in the Park
- Teamed with Los Altos High School to collect and recycle over 80 bicycles to needy students
- Co-sponsored the EV Fair at Los Altos High School featuring 18 electric vehicles
- Advocated for bike facilities (lanes, signs etc.) on El Camino Real
- Hosted 3 bike rides Lawn-Be-Gone Tour, Family Bike Day, and the Summer Solstice Ride

#### Zero Waste

- Distributed paper straws to local businesses and promoted bamboo-straw alternatives to milk tea businesses
- Created the Party Pack Loaner Program of reusable food service ware to eliminate single-use plastics at private parties

#### Other

- Employed 4 part-time, enthusiastic student summer interns on Conservation projects
- Hosted booths at the Los Altos Farmers' Market and Earth Day celebration in Los Altos Hills
- Grew online engagement year-over-year on Instagram 9% to 667 followers and Facebook 1% to 862 followers.
- Sponsored the holiday pedicab and participated in the Village Association Holiday Trees Display with a tree of fully compostable decorations
